## Evaluation – How It Could Work For Me

### Abstract

Evaluation may be used to find the value of or the quality of aspects of manual handling service delivery.

Accountability within National Services, especially within the field of health and safety is not a new concept. There has however, been a shift of focus towards a service user centred approach alongside a political policy of set targets to be met.

This session explores the links between organisational aims, service delivery, outcomes and evaluation.
